

FERMANAGH RAMBLERS & HILLWALKERS

CONSTITUTION

1 TITLE

The Club shall be called “Fermanagh Ramblers & Hillwalkers”, hereafter referred to as “the Club”, and shall be affiliated to “the Ulster Federation of Rambling Clubs” and will have appropriate insurance.

2 OBJECTIVES

To foster and promote rambling and hill walking.

3 MEMBERSHIP

The following are eligible for membership:

- Individuals who complete a membership application, pay the appropriate annual subscription as determined by the Annual General Meeting, and are prepared to adhere strictly to the Club’s Guidelines.
- Individual Member: Any person who is not a minor
- Honorary Member: Anyone who from time to time on whom the Club shall decide to confer the honour at the Annual General Meeting

4 EXPULSION OF MEMBERS

Members of the Club whose conduct is inappropriate or who decline to abide by any of the Club’s Guidelines/Rules may be expelled by a resolution passed at a meeting of the Club Committee where their annual fee may be forfeited. Members shall have a right to appeal in person to the Club Committee regarding any decision affecting them, provided that notice of such appeal is received in writing by the Club Secretary seven days after the notification of the decision.

5 OFFICERS

The officers of the Club shall be as follows:

- Chairperson
- Secretary
- Treasurer

6 ELECTION OF OFFICERS

All officers shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting of the Club, from, and by, the Members of the Club. All officers are elected for a period of one year, but may be re-elected to the same office or another office the following year up to a maximum of 3 successive years.

7 GENERAL COMMITTEE

The affairs of the Club shall be controlled by the General Committee comprising of the Officers of the Club and other Members elected from, and by, the Members of the Club. The General Committee shall meet during the year as and when deemed necessary under the direction of the Chairman.

The duties of the General Committee shall be:

- To control the affairs of the Club on behalf of its members.
- To keep accurate accounts of the Club's finances through the Club Treasurer. These should be available for inspection and scrutiny at the Annual General Meeting. The Club shall open a Bank account, and cheques may be signed by any of the Officers.
- To co-opt additional persons from the Club's membership as is felt necessary or beneficial.
- To make decisions by a simple majority vote. In the case of an equal vote, the Chairman shall be entitled to an additional casting vote.

8 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The Annual General Meeting of the Club shall be held during March each year. 21 days written notice shall be given to members at their postal address. Members must advise the Secretary in writing giving 14 day notice of any business to be discussed. A copy of

the agenda will be available for each member at the meeting. Failure to send notice, or non-receipt of notification shall not invalidate the Meeting.

The business of the Annual General Meeting shall be to:

- Confirm the minutes of the previous Annual General Meeting.
- Receive the Audited Accounts from the Treasurer.
- Receive the annual report from the Chairperson and Secretary.
- Elect officers of the Club and other General Committee Members.
- Review Club subscription rates, and agree fee for the forthcoming year.
- Transact other such business, and make proposals, as are incumbent and deemed necessary for the proper running of the Club.
- Nominations for Election of Officers shall be in writing to the Secretary at least 14 days before the Annual General Meeting date.

All meetings shall be chaired by the Chairperson or an appointed deputy. Decisions shall be by a simple majority; if necessary, Chairperson shall have an extra casting vote.

9 EXTRAORDINARY GENERAL MEETING

An Extraordinary General Meeting may be called at the written request signed by 25% or more of the Membership, and sent to the Secretary. Such a request must state in detail the proposed Agenda for the Meeting, which will then be convened. Voting rights will be as at the Annual General Meeting.

10 DISCLAIMER

The Club, and the Committee of the Club will be in no way responsible for any loss or injury incurred whilst on Club activities. All members partaking in Club activities shall be entirely and solely responsible for their own safety at all times. The person guiding the walk is a Guide and is pointing out a chosen route and the guide's decision is final.

11 DISSOLUTION

In the event of the dissolution of the Club all outstanding debts will be settled, and any surplus assets will be donated to an associate body or bodies to be decided by the General Committee.
